It is a stated fact that 18.1% of students with disabilities drop out of school. As a result, Iowa, through the IEP process, provides transition planning services for students who are age 14 and above. The IEP helps to prepare students while they are still in school for the important roles of adulthood, employment, education, independent living and community participation.

Studies also show that students with disabilities have experienced difficulties in finding or keeping employment, poor integration into the community, lack of a social network, and lack of independence. In addition, they have difficulties in gaining access to adult services, postsecondary education and training programs.
